









uilding leadership from within has been the success of our Network of Promotoras and Community Health Workers for the past 20 years. Our regional committees, coordinated by local volunteer leaders provide promotores within their region with workforce development and professional training. Currently, our regional committees meet monthly to identify local issues, assess local needs, and respond by developing a



robust action plan. Our regional committees create the environment in which leadership skills are built, organizing and advocacy skills are developed, and bring a cadre of local leaders with a shared vision of building a strong promotor movement led from the corazón!

It's with this shared vision of building strong leaders that our Network brought together 17 of our newly elected regional committee coordinators for a two-day retreat. MADERA

Promotores in Madera in collaboration with Madera's Department of Public Health, Unidad Popular Benito Juárez, and CalViva had a successful vaccination event on Sunday, March 20th from 3:00 to 5:00pm at the Madera Flea Market. Hosting this event on a weekend allowed for farmworkers and other members of the community to finally have the opportunity to get vaccinated. 11 people received their first dose, 12 people received the second dose, and 40 received a booster. Congratulations to the promotores for ensuring this event was held on a weekend and keeping in mind ALL members of their community!



SAN FERNANDO

Through the initiative of one of its members, Gabby, San Fernando's Regional Committee distributed 25 food baskets last month to seniors, and we are not stopping here! Many seniors are facing food insecurity and have been greatly affected by the pandemic. The baskets contained fresh fruits and vegetables along with masks and hand sanitizer. On March 26th promotores from the Orange County Regional Committee had a radio interview with Vicente Sarmiento, Santa Ana Mayor. community with their cases. Mayor Sarmiento was also asked about homelessnes in the area and he shared that a new shelter with sections for women and men will be operational in one month. A great round of applause to our promotoras who asked relevant and important questions. COACHELLA

The members of this committee have been pushing immigration initiatives in their regions. They have formed a strong connection with Congressman Raul Ruiz and have shared their communities' needs with him. Currently they are advocating for two bills:

- "Farm Workforce Modernization Act" (HR 1603) would allow for reforms to the H-2A agricultural guestworker program and create a merit-based visa program specifically designed for the nation's agricultural sector
- "Dream and Promise Act" (HR 6) would provide a path to citizenship for more than four million undocumented immigrants brought to the United States when they were 18 or younger.

UNITED IN ADVOCACY

Visión y Compromiso's growing presence advocating for community needs is being felt in Sacramento! Lawmakers recently asked Visión y Compromiso to give expert testimony on legislations that will improve our quality of life.

- ✓ María Lemus, Executive Director, was asked by Assemblymember Arambula (Delano) to share the critical role of promotores expanding health care outreach in the Governor's proposed outreach budget of \$350 million. See the video: https://fb.watch/caYAZZmuGh/
- ✓ Leonardo Dominguez, Regional Coordinator for the Central Coast committee, was asked to give expert testimony to the Assembly Human Services Committee for SB 861 (Senator Limon-Santa Barbara), a bill to expand dementia and Alzheimer's care to underserved communities. Read his testimony here.

Expert witnesses are selected by the bill author to share facts supporting the proposed bill when the bill is presented to the committee. Congratulations to both María Lemus and Leonardo Dominguez for elevating the importance of promotores to the needs of our communities!
