STANISLAUS



UNITED IN ADVOCACY

An important part of advocating for community improvements are Visión y Compromiso's promotores giving public support at legislative hearings. In July Irma Esquivel of the Stanislaus Regional committee gave public comment in support of AB-2847 Unemployment: Excluded Workers Pilot Program at the Senate Labor Committee. If passed by the Legislature and signed by the Governor, this bill will grant unemployment assistance for the first time to unemployed workers who are not documented. The bill was approved by the Labor Committee and now goes to the full Senate. Visión y Compromiso's Network Committees support bills each year in immigration, promotor workforce, health, and education.
